INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

NORTH DAKOTA STATE UNIVERSITY

AND

NORTH DAKOTA STATE COLLEGE OF SCIENCE

I. Parties

This Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into by and between North Dakota State University (herein after referred to as NDSU) and North Dakota State College of Science (herein after referred to as NDSCS), each individually a "Party" and collectively the "Parties". The Parties wish to collaborate in order to facilitate the transfer and degree completion of students earning the Information Systems Administrator A.A.S. at NDSCS to the Information Technology BS at NDSU.

II. Purpose

The purpose of this Information Technology (IT) Articulation is to provide a pathway for students completing an Information Systems Administrator A.A.S. at NDSCS to continue their study and complete a BS in Information Technology at NDSU, which would mutually benefit both institutions. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), the computer and information technology field is expected to increase much faster than the average growth for all occupations between 2022 and 2032 and thus there is a higher demand for the Information Technology BS degree. The Parties enter into this Agreement in the spirit of cooperation and mutually expect the following outcomes from this partnership:

- A. Increased Enrollment
- B. Greater access for specific student populations

III. Admission

It is agreed that those students who receive the Information Systems Administrator A.A.S. at NDSCS and meet all of the criteria listed below shall be accepted without further review at NDSU into the Information Science major. However, final admission to NDSU is contingent on submission of the student's application.

IV. Transfer Credit

- A. NDSU shall accept 60 semester credits from NDSCS if a student has completed the Information Systems Administrator A.A.S. degree (Appendix A). If students do not earn the degree, this articulation agreement does not apply.
- B. A grade of C or better is required for each course.
- C. Upon completion Information Systems Administrator A.A.S. at NDSCS, students shall meet all lower division general education requirements upon transfer at NDSU as outlined in the North Dakota University System General Education Requirements Transfer Agreement.

- D. University-Wide Degree Requirements (https://catalog.ndsu.edu/academic-policies/undergraduate-policies/degree-and-graduation/):
 - a) Resident Credit Requirement: Resident credits are earned from undergraduate courses that a student has registered and paid for at NDSU. Students must satisfactorily complete a minimum of 30 credits from courses offered at NDSU or via Tri-College registration as an NDSU student.
 - b) Upper Level Credit Requirements: Students must present a minimum of 36 credits in courses taken at the 300-400 level for degree completion. These credits may or may not be earned at NDSU.
 - c) Transfer Credits: Students presenting transfer credit must meet the NDSU residence credits as defined in a) and the minimum upper level credit defined in
 - b). Of the 30 credits earned in residence, a minimum of 15 semester credits must be in courses numbered 300 or above, and 15 semester credits must be in the student's curricula for their declared major.
- C. NDSCS grades shall be recorded on the NDSU academic record but not computed in the institutional cumulative GPA at NDSU.
- D. Please see the attached Transfer Guide (Appendix A).

V. Collaboration and Coordination

- A. During the period of this IT Articulation Agreement, NDSU shall:
 - i. Provide the students from NDSCS with the path to be successful in completing the BS degree.
- B. During the period of this IT Articulation Agreement, NDSCS shall:
 - i. Advertise and communicate this degree option to current students at NDSCS.

VI. Term, Termination and Other Provisions

- A. The IT Articulation Agreement is made effective on the date that both parties have fully executed the agreement. The term of this agreement shall be for 3 years.
- B. The Parties agree to review this Agreement and the Program once during this period at a time mutually convenient for the Parties but aiming for during the year prior to the end of this agreement's term.
- C. Notification of revisions to NDSU current and anticipated course offerings shall also be sent to NDSCS during the above review period.
- D. Either party may send written notice of terminating the IT Articulation Agreement a minimum of 60 days prior to the effective date of the termination.
- E. If this IT Articulation Agreement is terminated by either party, such termination shall not affect the status of students already in the pipeline shall continue to receive the benefits of the agreement, based on agreement provisions.
- F. A Letter of Review shall be sent between 30 and 60 days prior to contract expiration to ensure both parties can continue to fulfill the terms of this agreement or if contract revisions may be required.

VII. Notices

All notices concerning this memorandum of agreement and understanding shall be in writing and shall be considered to have been given at the time of receipt of notice by the other Party.
