Student Senate Budget Overview:

Last year's Senate Budget was \$32,883, with \$37,485

This year's budget is \$39,062 and we are currently on track to exceed this budget by the end of the year. The budget has not been increased since the 2020-2021 school year. Student Senate is looking at increasing the student fee to increase funding in the Student Senate Budget. The Senate has final decision on Student Activity Fees, which includes funding for:

North Dakota Student Association

IAC

Senator Larson explained that IAC approved supplies for the executive team to function better, approved funds for promotional items for NDSAs, reimbursed Valley City State and UND for their NDSAs, and discussed NDSA's budget and strategic plan.

SLAC

Senator Hollingsworth gave the SLAC report. SLAC discussed policy advocacy, proposed bills, and passed a resolution for legislative priorities supporting tenure, workforce training, and incentives for graduates to work in North Dakota. Passed a resolution opposing Measure 4, which would reduce property tax revenue and could decrease the state budget, impacting funding. The SLAC committee is in support of funding for on-campus housing.

SAC

Vice President Maudal gave the report on SAC. SAC discussed policy advocacy, proposed mental health resolution, and dual-credit enrollment for four-year institutions resolution which both had Do Not Pass recommendations. The main concern with each was if four-year colleges receive dual-credit funding two-year institutions, particularly NDSCS, would lose part of the \$4 million earnings they gain from dual-credit.

GA

Vice President Maudal gave the report on GA. GA voted in Lily Beth as Chief Administrator. Failed numerous resolutions. There was a discussion on the removal of the Chief of Staff. NDSA President made a public statement on behalf of NDSA opposing Measure 4.

Breakout Sessions

Vice President Maudal gave the report of Breakout Sessions. In our Breakout Session with the other two-year colleges, we addressed on-campus living conditions, specifically the challenges faced by two-year institutions in providing adequate housing options. Some of the two-year institutions do not have on-campus housing.
