  - *Senator Larson met with dining at 8 a.m. on Wednesday. They discussed getting cheaper to-go containers in the Wildcat Express, and food waste with the to-go containers. It takes students about 10 minutes to get through the burger line.*
- Management Team ----- President Hoff
  - *Vice President Maudal attended the management meeting for President Hoff. NDSCS purchased a 51-passenger bus for the athletic teams next year. NDSU wants to start offering dual credit, which would be a major drawback for NDSCS. NDSCS generates 4.5 million dollars a year from dual credit and a majority of dual credit students are from Cass County. NDSCS is sending out a Student Satisfaction Survey in November. A semi, tractor, and bobcat have been donated to NDSCS for students to use. Science of Leadership already has 30 applications, the deadline is October 9<sup>th</sup> to apply. There are problems with fire alarms being set off by febreeze on campus which is a prohibited item. The cultural center is looking at being updated by replacing carpet and chairs. There is a big interest for NDSCS to get an Archery Club but NDSCS needs a certified instructor/coach to create the club. Students with internet issues need to go to IT to fix the issue and find a location. IT can't help students who fill out an online anonymous form because they don't know the location of the issue or student.*
